


Nana : John, why did you decide to go to a Japanese high school?

John : First, I really like Japanese anime and video games. I was ( ① ) by their stories and designs, and I also became interested in other parts of the culture, such as food, sports, and traditional customs. Then I began studying Japanese.

Nana : I see. Are you happy about being here now?

John : Of course. Even in the USA, we can learn about Japan online, but it's not the same as actually experiencing daily life in Japan. Also, I have made a lot of friends here and I talk with them a lot in Japanese, so I think my Japanese is ( ② ) quickly. In the future, I would like to teach Japanese in my home country.

Nana : Wow! That's a wonderful dream. ③[ could / wish / like / study abroad / I / you / I ].

John : I think you should do it if you really want to, Nana. Japan is an amazing country, but you can broaden your view by going to other countries and seeing and hearing a lot of different things. When do you want to go?

Nana : I'd like to do it someday, but there are some concerns about living in other countries.

John : Actually, our teacher asked me to make a speech about studying abroad in his English class next week. ④I'll talk about what high school students in the world think about studying abroad. Here's a chart I made for it. Look at this. It shows the results of a survey that asked Japanese, American, Chinese, and South Korean high school students, "Are you interested in studying abroad?" It doesn't include the students who didn't answer the question.

- Nana : So, American and Korean students are more interested in studying abroad than students in the other two countries, but the percentage of Korean students who answered “A little interested” is higher than that of American students. I’m surprised that nearly 50% of Japanese students answered, “Not interested at all” or “Not very interested”.
- John : I thought so, too. In another survey I found, more than 90% of Japanese high school students answered, “I am satisfied with living in Japan,” and “I like my country.”
- Nana : Maybe they are not so interested in foreign countries because they enjoy their lives in Japan.
- John : I guess so. Look at the second chart. It shows the top five answers from Japanese high school students to the question: “What would be your concerns about studying abroad?”
- Nana : All of these are my own concerns, too.
- John : I understand their concerns about safety because Japan is one of the safest countries in the world.  About the second concern, I heard that the Japanese government has a program to help high school students pay for studying abroad.
- Nana : Really? That’s good ( ⑤ ). Thank you.
- John : About the other concerns, Nana, I just think of studying abroad as a chance to learn and experience new things.
- Nana : You are right. Well, I’ll check out the government’s program later.
- John : That’s great! Let me tell you one more thing. Since I came to Japan, many people have asked me about my country. Every time, I realize I don’t know much about it. So, I think it’s better to know more about your country before you study abroad.  I’m going to talk about this in my speech.
- Nana : OK. Thank you for the great advice. I’m looking forward to your speech.

①The oldest tea shop in London is a little away from the center of the city. It was built in 1717. The shop sign says “TWININGS.” There is a \*royal symbol above the sign, and two Chinese statues sit on both sides of the sign. These statues represent the origin of tea in China, and there is a gold lion above them. It was a symbol of the shop’s original name, Golden Lyon, and now it also represents respect for its \*founder, Thomas Twining.

In 1706, Thomas bought a coffee shop called Tom’s Coffee House. At that time, coffee shops were very popular meeting places for men in London, and there were over 2,000 shops there. There was a law school near his shop, and it became a popular meeting place for the students from the school. People said, “Law school students should go to Tom’s Coffee House.” In 1708, Thomas married a woman named Margaret. Although Thomas was only in his second year of business, it was going very well.

Around 1717, ②Thomas’s shop became so busy that it was difficult to do all the work. It sold coffee, tea, and also other products such as oranges, lemons, sugar, and butter. The shop was too small, and another building was needed. Thomas bought the building next to his shop, added it to the shop, and named it Golden Lyon — it meant a Chinese lion — because tea from China was ③sanctified and it reminded people of a golden lion.

Around the same time, people in London started to hear and talk about Princess Anne’s love of tea, and women began to drink tea too. Thomas then decided to sell only tea at Golden Lyon. At that time, women were not allowed to go into coffee shops because of tradition, but Golden Lyon welcomed them. ④It was enjoyed by many women, and the shops quickly became popular and famous.

Thomas Twining got married, had four children, and died in 1741 at the age of 66. He worked hard to develop the tea business for 35 years. After Thomas’s death, his child, Daniel, continued his father’s business, and the number of customers kept growing. After Daniel died in 1762 at the young age of 49, his wife Mary protected the history of the Twining shop for 17 years. Their son, Richard, began helping his mother when he was only 14 years old, and they continued to manage the shop. Richard later asked the government to reduce the high tax on tea and this was accepted. ⑤In this way, more and more tea was sold in London, and tea became part of the culture in the city.

The Twinings Company was continued by Thomas’s \*descendants, and the fifth generation, Richard Twining II, was given a royal \*warrant by Queen Victoria in 1837. The Queen started the “four o’clock tea” custom. Tea got more popular among many people in London and became the national drink. In the early 20th century, the Twinings Company was in business for more than 200 years, and tea was enjoyed all over Europe. The company opened shops in other countries too. Even during the war, it was asked to continue providing tea. That’s how the Twining family’s teas were recognized for their high quality.

The Twinings Company has now been in business for over 300 years and has continued to provide tea to 96 countries around the world. Stephen Twining, the 10th generation, leads the company now. The shop Thomas opened in 1706 has become larger by adding two more buildings next to it. There is a message that people in the Twining family have told for many generations: “The Twinings Company was lucky because its staff worked hard to protect the company. So many people have worked here and given their lives to the company.” [ ア ] Today, about 100 million cups of tea are drunk in the UK every day.
